please note that the following list is a guide only and you should identify any additional documents that apply to your situation. Refer to the <u>Canada Border</u> for travelling to Canada. The following documents should be in your carry-on luggage during your travel:

- 1. NBCC Letter of Acceptance: If you have not started your program of study at NBCC, bring your letter of acceptance. If you have already started your program at NBCC, bring a confirmation of enrolment letter.
- 2. Letter of introduction or study permit: If you have not yet travelled to Canada, you must bring your letter of introduction (study permit approval letter) and receive your study permit at the border. If you already have a study permit, bring that document with you.
- 3. Passport: We suggest making copies of your passport and storing those separately from the original (both on paper and digitally).
- 4. eTA/ Temporary Resident Visa: Depending on your country of citizenship, you will need a valid <u>Temporary Resident Visa</u> (TRV) or <u>Hectronic Travel Authorization</u> (eTA). U.S citizens are exempt from this requirement.
